

**Want to put a bit of art into your nights? Take an evening Art & About Sydney Tour. Map references are included so print a copy of the map to take with you.**

There's nothing like starting off big, so head to the corner of George and Park Streets, where you'll discover **Tsunami 1.26 [1]**, a gigantic aerial net created by acclaimed American artist Janet Echelman. Lit by spectacular coloured lights, and flying high above the city, this extraordinary work was inspired by the events that followed the Chile earthquake of 2010.

Next stop is Hyde Park, wander through to the Central Walkway with this year's finalists in the popular **Sydney Life exhibition [2]** capturing the many sides of our city in striking large-scale images. From the spectacularly large to the small and unnoticed, walk to Martin Place and check out **Acts of Kindness [3]**, a new work from acclaimed British artist Michael Landy. Exploring the often ignored acts of kindness in our daily lives, this is a collaboration with Kaldor Public Art Projects. While you are there check out the street banners. Featuring responses from Sydneysiders to the question: **What If? [3]**

Next, it's time to get lost in the network of inner city laneways. There's knitting, graffiti, installations and much more in **Laneway Art**. Follow the route from Bulletin Place (**Bubbleway [4.1]** by Rebar), to Bridge Lane (**Donut [4.2]** by Brook Andrew), Tank Stream Way (Untitled by **Barry McGee [4.3]**), Sussex Lane (Untitled by **Magda Sayeg [4.4]**), Skittle Lane (**peri(pher)al scopes [4.5]** by Heidi Axelson, Andrew Pupilli, Hugo Moline) and Mullins Street and Market Row (**Deconstructing Ways [4.6]** by Isidro Blasco). If it's a Thursday night, you may also want to check out the program of video installations on rickshaw viewing screens appearing around the City as part of **The Amazing Rolling Picture Show**.

Then head down to **Unguarded Moments [5]** in Millers Point, where Killanoodle and Sarah Barns have created a series of stunning projections, featuring intimate portraits from the past. Begin at Abraham Mott Hall, walking down Kent street towards Walsh Bay and Windmill steps, then along Hickson Road towards Sydney Harbour Bridge, where you'll finish up at the roundabout near Pottinger Street. If you've felt like you're being watched, it isn't paranoia – just the life-like sense of the past coming back to life in an area that's rich with history.
